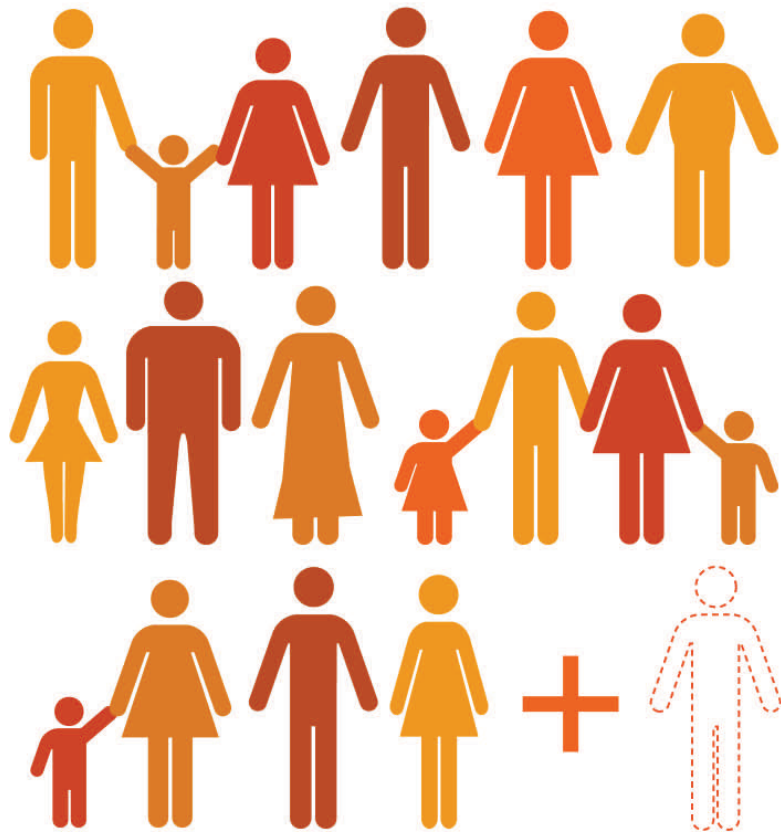

introduction

This booklet aims to outline our vision and values, what is involved in being an active member at Grace and answer some of the common questions.

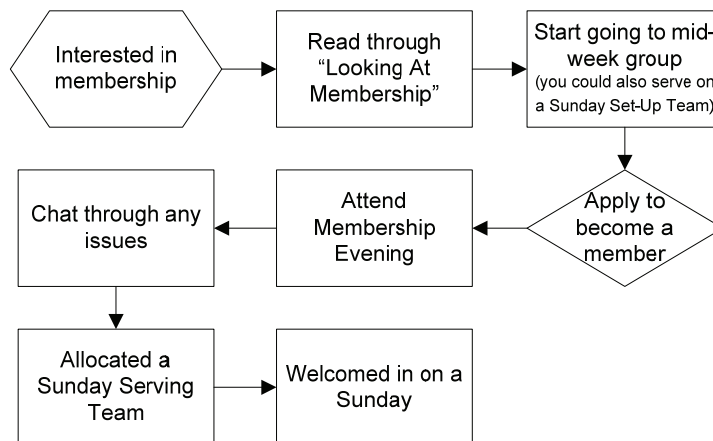

You will then be invited to a membership evening where you will be able to meet the leadership of Grace Church over a meal, hear Nick and Penny's story, and find out the part you can play in what God is doing here.

After chatting through any questions or issues with you we'll welcome you into membership on the next available Sunday.

Membership Process Overview



how did grace church begin?

Grace Church began when God called Nick and Penny Sharp to plant a Newfrontiers church in Nottingham.



They promptly moved from the church in Surrey where Nick had been on staff for many years and began gathering a small group of people in their home in the autumn of 2002, moving to meetings on Sunday mornings in January 2003.

Nick says that God gave him a clear vision of what Grace Church was to be like; "God put it on my heart to build a church which was a loving family - a place to belong, grow and serve - yet at the same time to be a family on a mission - to reach this city and beyond with the gospel. I knew He also wanted it to be a church deeply rooted in the teachings of the Bible, and because of that, strongly charismatic".

From those early days, the church has been characterised by reaching those who don't yet know Jesus, training leaders, thorough Bible teaching and vibrant, charismatic worship where the gifts of the Spirit are freely used and the presence of God is experienced.

Although God has grown us from a handful into the hundreds on Sundays and small groups meeting across the city during the week, Grace Church is still very much a family and there is still a huge mission ahead of us - in Nottingham, the surrounding region and the nations – we hope you'll join us!

what is the vision of grace church?

We are a family.

- ◆ Our faith in Jesus unites us as a family, with God as our Father and the Holy Spirit living among us.
- ◆ As we grow we will continue to become increasingly diverse through the reconciling message of the cross calling people from all ages, backgrounds & nationalities into His family, demonstrating the message we proclaim.¹

We are on a mission.

- ◆ To make disciples of all nations across greater Nottingham.
- ◆ To train & send leaders & workers across the UK and the nations with Newfrontiers²

who are Newfrontiers?

Grace Church is part of Newfrontiers which is a worldwide family of hundreds of churches together on a mission to restore the church, make disciples, train leaders, start churches and reach the nations.



To serve this mission more than 5000 leaders gather each year at the Together on a Mission Conference held in Brighton where delegates from 50 nations enjoy inspiring teaching, worship and ministry. Newfrontiers is led by Terry Virgo.

why do we have a membership?

The radical commission of Jesus to his church was not to make members but disciples. So why do we have a membership?

To some the idea of becoming a member is more about a dusty list of names, or people paying their subscriptions to an organisation. The New Testament however, speaks about being members of the body of Christ and members of God's family. Put simply, members are the church!

Grace Church is made up of individuals from different backgrounds, cultures and generations who have encountered the love of God and been adopted into his family. Worshipping Jesus and serving one another we are committed together to the mission he has called us to in Nottingham and beyond.

We love having new people coming to our meetings and we want to help those who have become Christians find their place with us where they can experience genuine community, grow in their love for God and commit to serve in the mission he has called us to.

how do you "become a Christian"?

Well there is good news and bad news. The bad news is that none of us are perfect and have all fallen short of God's standard.³ All of us have disappointed ourselves, we have hurt others, and we have done wrong, but sin is not a social concept – it's a theological one⁴ – against God and Him alone have we sinned.

God opposes all that is evil and wrong so our sin separates us from the very one who gives life and purpose and in the end we will face judgement.⁵

The good news is that God has provided a way to know and experience the adventure of life living with and for Him. Jesus who is God the Son came to die on a cross to pay the penalty we deserve for our sin that we could be forgiven and made right with God. He was raised to life and “is able also to save forever those who draw near to God through Him”.⁶

Here are the 5 ways we need to respond to the gospel as seen in Acts 2.

1. **Repent**, which means to be sorry enough to change - change your mind about your past, agreeing with God’s verdict about your sin and turning to Him for forgiveness.⁷

2. **Believe**, not merely about Jesus – even the demons know who he is, but trusting in Him in your heart as the one who died for you and was raised to life.⁸

3. **Be Baptised**, which means being “plunged under water” as Jesus’ first disciples were.⁹

4. **Receive** the Holy Spirit as a gift.¹⁰

5. **Belong** or “get added in” as a member of God’s people locally.¹¹

When we leave our past and put our trust in Jesus as our Lord we begin a new relationship as sons and daughters, forgiven, clean and right with our Father in heaven and members of his family.

what does church membership look like in the bible?

Looking back to the first church in Acts gives us a model of what belonging to a church looks like in practice. Luke tells us they “devoted themselves” to the church in various ways.

“Devoted” is a strong word that involves our hearts and minds, our time, our energy and our passion. This devotion does not come from a decision to “do the right thing”, but rather from a life changing encounter with the living God.¹²

*They devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and to the fellowship, to the breaking of bread and to prayer. Everyone was filled with awe, and many wonders and miraculous signs were done by the apostles. All the believers were together and had everything in common. Selling their possessions and goods, they gave to anyone as he had need. Every day they continued to meet together in the temple courts. They broke bread in their homes and ate together with glad and sincere hearts, praising God and enjoying the favour of all the people. And the Lord added to their number daily those who were being saved. **Acts 2:42-47***

i) We devote ourselves to the Word of God.

We have the apostles teaching in the Bible which is not just a book full of good advice; it is God’s revealed will for our lives. We therefore not only recognise the authority of the Bible as final in what we believe and how we should live but we are also committed to studying it that we may live to please our Father who loves us and has saved us.

We look at questions in small groups during the week to apply the biblical teaching we have heard on Sundays and encourage personal study of the Bible for all our members.

ii) We devote ourselves to one another.

Becoming a Christian is not an individual business just as playing football is not about individuals. With God as our Father we have been adopted into his family. With His love in our hearts we love one another thereby revealing to those who don't know Him who we belong to.¹³

For members this will include:

being committed to meeting together on Sundays
getting involved in serving on a Sunday team
meeting in a small group regularly

Our small groups are not simply about weekly meetings but communities where friendships form with people looking out for each other; praying for each other, helping out, being a shoulder to cry on and a group to celebrate with through the ups and downs of real life.

iii) We devote ourselves to Christ.

The cross is central to our salvation and breaking bread together brings us back again and again to what Jesus has done for us: in the past the penalty is paid for our sin; in the present His victory sets us free from the enslaving power of sin, and in the future we will one day be free from the very presence of sin. We break bread on Sundays and in our small groups as part of our worship and devotion to Jesus.

iv) We devote ourselves to prayer.

Praying is an expression of the relationship we have with our heavenly Father. We are recognising He is in charge, that we are dependent on Him and we want to live His way. Reading through Acts we find that the church gathering together to pray was central to who they were.

We encourage every member to participate in bringing contributions of praise and worship on a Sunday and take opportunities to pray for individuals during ministry times. Small groups and monthly prayer meetings are also places you will be able to get involved with ministry and pray for wider issues and initiatives.

v) An overflow of giving.

The image of throwing a few coppers into the plate at the end of a church service couldn't be further from the joy filled overflow of generous giving seen in the early church.¹⁴ With hearts on fire for God they recognised that everything they had belonged to Him.

"Our perspective on and handling of money is a litmus test of our true character. It is an index of our spiritual life... God does not apologise for watching with intense interest what we do with the money he has entrusted to us" Randy Alcorn: Money, Possessions and Eternity

Giving a tithe (tenth) of their income as the Old Testament taught and beyond was motivated by a deep sense of devotion to Christ and commitment to the mission he had called them to.

vi) An overflow of worship.

There was something infectious about these first Christians filled with the Spirit and overflowing with worship,¹⁵ each bringing something to God, or from God to encourage and strengthen the church.¹⁶

We encourage members therefore to participate wholeheartedly! Pray out or bring a scripture perhaps with some explanation; start a song using the song book to give you confidence and the band will pick it up and lead; bring a spiritual song in English or tongues or bring an interpretation to a tongue brought in the meeting.

God may want to speak through you “for the strengthening of the church” through a prophetic word or picture with an explanation.¹⁷ The best place to begin using spiritual gifts is in your small group to build confidence.

vii) A growing community.

Many are under the impression today that the church is boring and irrelevant whilst at the same time longing for community and purpose in their lives. Yet when God captivates hearts the results look like the growing church in Acts 2.

Good news travels fast and changed lives are an attractive reason for others to find out what has happened. Knowing God, you have the privilege of having a story worth sharing. The gospel literally means “good news” and as Jesus was sent to bring it to us so He sends us to bring it to others. In Grace Church we will regularly provide training and encouragement to help you grow in sharing your faith with others.

what does membership of grace church involve?

In brief we would be looking for the following:

- ◆ Baptised in water by immersion as a believer.
- ◆ Baptised in the Holy Spirit (or seeking God for this).
- ◆ Committed to our vision and values (Explained in this booklet. To hear more you can also listen to “Our Values” and “Our Calling” at www.gracechurchnottingham.org).
- ◆ Regular attendance at our Sunday and monthly Prayer Meetings.
- ◆ Involvement in a small group.
- ◆ Serving in an area of church life.
- ◆ Committed to regular sacrificial financial giving to the church.
- ◆ Attend our Family Meetings which are held two or three times a year and are for members only. These are key opportunities to share vision, important news, finance updates etc.
- ◆ Left any previous church well (NB: students who are currently members of a “home” church can still become members of Grace without leaving their previous church).

how do I join grace church?

Becoming a member at Grace Church is saying “count me in with all God is doing here!” So the first step is getting involved!

Come to our Sunday meetings and start serving on a Sunday set-up team

Get involved in a small group

The second step is to find out more about membership at Grace Church by reading through this “Looking at Membership” booklet. Then chat through with your group leader any questions that may have been raised.

The third step is to apply for membership. You can do this online at www.gracechurchnottingham.org.

Alternatively application forms can be found in the Welcome Area on a Sunday along with Gift Aid forms, for tax payers. (Also see Appendix 3.) If you need to be baptised we will arrange this with you too.

Please complete these and put them in the box at the Welcome Area on a Sunday or post to the Grace Church office.

The fourth step, will be to come to a membership evening where you will be able to meet the leadership at Grace and hear more about our vision. You will also be able to chat through any further questions.

Once we have chatted through membership with you the fifth step is to welcome you in, usually on the next available Sunday!¹⁸

why do I need to be baptised to be a member?

The last words of the resurrected Jesus before going back to heaven were to “make disciples of all nations, baptising them in the name of the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit...”¹⁹ Those who accepted the gospel and became disciples were baptised in obedience to Jesus’ teaching.²⁰

The word “baptise” literally means to submerge. Getting baptised is a picture of what has happened in a believer; the old life without God is dead and buried with Christ, and being raised up out of the water pictures the new life that began with Christ through faith.

Jesus makes the connection between becoming a disciple and being baptised. Therefore, we believe it is not an option for those who want to follow Jesus.

how do I get baptised?

Baptism Sundays are always a highlight in the Grace Church calendar with many friends and family coming to see those being baptised in a pool that we set up in our usual venue.

If you have not been baptised as a believer ask your small group leader who will be able to arrange a time to chat with you further about getting baptised, answer any questions you may have and make arrangements for your baptism.

what does “receiving the Spirit” mean in the bible?

Even before you became a Christian the Holy Spirit, who is the third person of the Trinity (Father, Son and Holy Spirit), was at work in you. He convicted you of your sin and need for forgiveness,²¹ and caused you to be born again.²²

In fact, without the Spirit no one can become a Christian²³ but the Bible also speaks about “receiving the Spirit”²⁴ as a distinct conscious experience and a normal part of becoming a Christian. This is what Paul was looking for in the group of Ephesians he found in Acts 19, asking them “Did you receive the Holy Spirit when you believed?”²⁵

Peter and John in Samaria were similarly looking for this in the believers there. Despite miracles and “great joy” in the city, they needed to “receive the Holy Spirit”²⁶ so Peter and John prayed for them.

In Acts 10 by contrast, no such questions needed to be asked as all could see that Cornelius’ household had received the Spirit!²⁷

Receiving or being baptised in the Spirit²⁸ is the occasion when you first receive the power of the Holy Spirit. Jesus spoke of this as the “gift my Father promised” to empower his disciples to witness to non-believers²⁹ and the apostles recognised there was something missing in believers lives without it.

how do we receive the Holy Spirit?

Jesus is the one who baptises with the Holy Spirit so he is the one we must come to.³⁰ He promises all who are thirsty will receive if they ask³¹ so we need to come believing his promises. Repent of any known sin, be obedient to God and receive.³² It can also be helpful to ask others to ask with you.

what about speaking in tongues?

Have you ever wanted to pray for a situation but not known quite how to pray? Or maybe you have just run out of words to express your worship to God? Tongues, which is a gift the Spirit gives us, enables us to “speak out” what is in our heart without having to find the words to express ourselves to God.³³ You will not know exactly what you are saying because it is your spirit that is speaking to God without going through your mind³⁴ which may sound like a drawback but actually it is a great help when we do not know what to pray.

You will hear people praying out in tongues in our meetings too but you will also hear someone interpret what has been prayed³⁵ so that we can all add our Amen!

You do not have to speak in tongues but there is no reason why you should not have the benefit of this gift.³⁶

how do you view the roles of men and women?

Our culture has a lot to say about this question, but it is our commitment to the Bible that shapes our thinking and practice in all areas of life and ministry, including the roles of men and women in church and the home.³⁷

Man and woman, though different, together reflect the likeness or image of God³⁸ and are therefore equal in status and value to God.³⁹ They reflect the equality that is within the Godhead between Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Although equal in status however, each member of the trinity has a different role. Likewise, we find the Bible teaches men and women have different roles.

Within marriage the husband has responsibility for his wife to love her as Christ loved the Church, to provide for her, protect and lead her and his family.⁴⁰ The wife is to submit to her husband's servant leadership as the Church submits to the headship of Christ.

The New Testament connects this pattern of leadership in the family to leadership of the church⁴¹ and teaches that the governing and teaching roles of eldership within the church are restricted to men.⁴²

In practice, although women would not bring the regular Sunday preaching, we actively encourage involvement of both men and women in the growing number of ministries in the church.

Women are leading teams, teaching and training in our missions, leadership development and children's workers departments, leading

worship, speaking at community groups etc so there are plenty of opportunities for both men and women to get involved! The governing of the church rests with the elders but they work with wider teams that include women as well.

how do finances work?

As a church we are totally self-funding, by means of members' offerings. These are used to serve the mission of the church and wider ministry and include:

- Tithing our income to Newfrontiers to help fund apostolic ministry in the UK and the nations.
- Servicing our city centre facilities including heating and maintenance.
- An expanding salaried staff team.
- Running our offices.
- Funding all our central ministries; Children's work, Youth, evangelism, soup run, CAP money & alpha courses etc.
- Purchase of equipment.
- Gifts to other churches and ministries and more.
- In addition, we take occasional special offerings, currently about once a term. These may be for apostolic ministry to other nations, disaster relief etc.

how to give regularly in grace church?

If you are a tax payer please complete and return the Gift Aid Declaration at the back of this booklet. As a registered charity this allows us to claim back 28% of all you give from the government, which of course greatly enhances your contribution to the church at no cost to you whilst allowing us to fund even more ministry.

We take an offering every Sunday, and you are free to place your offering in the basket. You can use a cheque or if you prefer, cash. However, if you do give cash and you are Gift Aiding your offering, please remember to identify it as coming from you (i.e. in an envelope with your name on it) otherwise we will not be able to claim the tax back. Envelopes are available in the offering baskets that are passed round.

You can give weekly or monthly but it helps us most with our budgeting if you are able to give monthly.

What is most helpful of all to us is if you set up a Standing Order with your bank, so the money is transferred at the same time each month automatically.

appendix 1 - grace church values

1. The central place of the Church in Gods purposes

God's plan is to have loving communities of God's people; devoted to God and one another. The church is the final expression of the wisdom of God on earth.

2. The Authority of Scripture

We have a serious commitment to regular teaching of God's word and believe that scripture's authority is final.

3. The grace of God

We are assured of the Grace of God in our lives, both individually and corporately and are clear about the full benefits of being in Christ.

4. Baptism in the Holy Spirit

This gift is for all believers and brings us into a genuine life in the Holy Spirit and an eager desire for all His gifts.

5. Genuine freedom to worship in the Holy Spirit

All are able to participate in corporate worship bringing contributions and use Spirit gifts.

6. Elders

Churches are led by elders who are ordained by the Holy Spirit and recognised and confirmed through apostolic ministry. These men are to be helped in fulfilling their calling through ongoing fellowship with Ephesians 4 travelling ministries.

7. Family life

Family life is highly valued and Godly parenting is taught and encouraged.

8. Membership

Our churches have a distinct membership entered into through a clearly established expression of commitment.

9. Baptism in water

Baptism by immersion is an important part of response to the gospel and is necessary for membership.

10. Every member ministry

We believe in the priesthood of all believers and so everyone is encouraged to find their place of service.

11. Remembering the poor

This is expressed through ministry to the poor, social action and financial giving, both locally and globally.

12. Evangelism & church planting

We are committed to obeying the great commission and reaching our communities for Christ.

13. Financial giving

We have a serious commitment to regular, joyful and generous giving.

14. Commitment to wider Newfrontiers mission

We are a family of churches on a mission to restore the church, make disciples, train leaders, plant churches and reach nations; believing that we can do more together than we can apart.

15. Excellent relationships with other believers

Individuals, churches and other “streams” of churches.

appendix 2 - statement of doctrine

The Bible

The Bible is utterly trustworthy (infallible) and inspired by God. It is enough (sufficient) for teaching us what to believe and how to live. The Holy Spirit helps us to understand (illuminate) the Bible.

God

God is one God but three persons – Father, Son and Holy Spirit. (This mystery is called the Trinity).

God made everything that exists and keeps it all going.

Man

Although men and women were made perfect in the beginning, they turned away from God. Because of this, mankind is now spiritually dead, born sinful and completely unable to turn towards God – without the Holy Spirit giving life (regeneration).

Jesus

Jesus Christ is fully God. He is the second member of the Trinity. Yet he became fully human when He was born from a virgin (incarnation).

Jesus Christ earned our way to heaven (salvation). He did this through His perfect life and His death on the cross. He became our substitute and traded His perfection for our guilt. God punished Jesus instead. (This is called the atonement).

Jesus rose from the dead on the third day (not just spiritually but physically). There were many witnesses. Soon afterwards He was taken up to heaven where He is now ruling over everything and praying for his Church (interceding).

Salvation

Men and women can now receive – by faith – the perfection (righteousness) of Jesus as a free gift, because of atonement. This means people can be completely forgiven and made righteous – even though they are sinners. (This is called justification).

Holy Spirit

The Holy Spirit was sent by Jesus after His return to heaven. He comforts, counsels, empowers, and leads believers. He also challenges non-Christians about their sin (conviction) – and brings them to Jesus (conversion). He also works to make believers more holy (sanctification) and gives them gifts to help them serve God.

Church

Jesus is building His new community called the Church. There is the universal Church (all the Christians in the world) and the local Church – a group of believers, in a particular area, who are committed to Jesus and each other. The local church should bring in the rule of God (His Kingdom) wherever they are. God is worshipped and His word is preached. People are born again, the poor are cared for and the sick people are healed. Believers are baptised in water as a sign of commitment and as a symbol of their death and resurrection in Jesus Christ. The Lord's Supper also followed, to celebrate Jesus' death.

Final Judgement

God's Kingdom will come in its fullness with the personal and glorious return of Jesus to Earth. He will judge all of mankind He will give everlasting joy to the righteous (believers) and everlasting punishment to the wicked.
